



7. Click “Start



Navigating a Group Session as a Teacher:

- **Start Polling:** Allows students to submit their answers.
- **Stop Polling:** Allows you to pause the assignment. Students will not be able to submit an answer during this time.
- **Next Question:** Allows you to advance to the next question. Students cannot navigate between questions without action from you.
- **Group Session Results:** You can see how your students are performing on the assignment.
- **Save for Later:** Allows you to save all progress on a Group Session and return to it later.
- **End Session:** Ends the session and posts all student results. The *Group Session Report* can be accessed on the *Reports* page.
